## FINANCIAL AID AND TAP

The New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) helps eligible New York State residents attending in-state post-secondary institutions pay for tuition. Because TAP is a grant, it does NOT have to be paid back. **How do I apply?** Complete the **Free** Application for Federal Student Aid – the FAFSA – at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). You and your guardian need a Federal Student Aid Identification number (FSA ID) to complete and electronically sign the FAFSA. You may apply for the FSA ID in advance at [fsaid.ed.gov](http://fsaid.ed.gov). If you are a NYS resident applying to a college in NYS, follow the direct link from the FAFSA to the TAP application.
